Rethink, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Repurpose, Recycle

Rethink – Do I really need it? Could I borrow it? Can this be used in another way?

Refuse – Say "no thank you" to items you don't need/want. Could you bring your own bags to the grocery store?

<u>Reduce/Reuse</u> – Use reusable and refillable packaging where possible

- Earth Refillery: Offers shampoo, all purpose cleaner, dish soap, laundry soap
- Fresh Thyme: Bulk grains, beans, nuts, seeds, snacks, dried fruits, candies, nut butters, oils, and vinegar.
- Global Infusion: Bulk herbs, spices, and teas.
- Moondrop Herbals: Bulk herbs, teas, and spices packaged in paper bags (does not allow containers brought from home).
 Petrichor Market: Bulk liquid soaps, cleaners, shampoo, conditioner, lotion, and more, plus low-waste goods such as reusable bags, utensils, wooden brushes, and bar soaps.
- South East Market: Grains, pasta, flours and baking supplies, beans, nuts, seeds, and more.
- Buy Nothing: Connect with others in your community to reuse existing items before purchasing new or throwing away
- Freecycle Front Door: Connect with others in your community to reuse existing items before purchasing new or throwing away
- Midtown Lending Library: The Midtown Neighborhood Association has created a tool lending library
- Little Free Library: Borrow, share, swap books with neighbors
- GR Outside Gear Library
- Kent District Library & Grand Rapids Public Library
- Thrift shop or buy vintage

NOTE Grand Rapids Ophthalmology also will take contact lens waste but will ONLY accept Bausch and Lomb contact lens packaging.
